## Background

- Yearly civil society forum prior to the WHA to develop collective civil society position regarding key issues.
- Limited possibility to influence the health decision-making
- The role of WHO itself is diminished Vs the role of monetary organizations and powerful states
- Global Health Governance needs a serious well-informed reform

## Objectives

- to review the prevailing structures and dynamics of global health governance (within the broader context of global economic governance);
- to explore the proposition that a more representative, more democratic regime of global health governance might contribute to more developmental, more equitable and more sustainable health policies;
